HOW TO PLAY

The game of ALICE IN WONDERLAND is played with 48 cards, made up of 16 sets, each comprising three cards.

The three cards of a set bear the same number, and in each set there is what is called a leading card.

For example:—With the cards bearing the No. 8, the leading card is the "King in Court," which directs the player to find the "Knave" and the "Lawyers," the two other cards to complete.

The game may be played by several—the more the merrier.

The cards after shuffling and cutting are dealt singly, face downwards, in rotation, to each player. After dealing, each player examines his cards and makes up from what he holds in his hand as many complete sets as possible, before actual play begins. Completed sets are laid on the table, face downwards, in front of the player.

Actual play begins with the person on the dealer's left, who selects from his hand a leading card and exposes it on the table. He now calls on any player he chooses, for one of the cards required to complete the set. If successful in his call and he can complete his set he must do so, and add it to any already in front of him.

Should the card called for only make two of the set, he may call on the same or any other player, for the remaining card. If unsuccessful, he must allow the player called upon to take a card from his hand, without that player seeing which card he is taking.

A completed set allows him to continue calling for any he requires until he incurs a forfeiture.

Should a player be without a leading card he must forfeit a card to the one who played last, and the player on the left continues the game.

After completing a set and being without a leading card, he does not forfeit, but play passes to the player on his left.

No player may expose more than one leading card at a time, and he must complete that set before exposing another.

When a player has exhausted all his cards except a leading card exposed on the table, that card is forfeited to the player whom he unsuccessfully challenges for a card of the same set.

The winner of the game is the one who completes the most sets.
